October highlights.



trips

Please remember to sign children up for trips via Arbor as soon as they are available and make payments before the closing date. Speak to Mrs Hanlon and Mrs Davis in the office if you need help to pay or to see what financial support you may be eligible for. Any children who do not attend a trip with their class must still come to school and will work in another classroom.

homework expectations

Following our parent survey, we would like to clarify homework expectations for each class.

Reception: Yellow books are sent home once a week for letter formation or fine motor skill practice.

Reception, Year 1 & Year 2: Reading via Collins Hub is encouraged three times a week for children to showcase their phonics practice at home. We know that this is difficult for some families with access to appropriate devices so encourage adults at home to share children's library books with them too. All children have a log in to Numbots to practise composition of number for up to 5 minutes, four times a week.

In **Year 1 & Year 2**, teachers will send phonics and spelling homework as and when appropriate, later in the year.

Key Stage 2: Children have a weekly spelling practice sheet linked to their work in class. This should be completed on Showbie if possible but a paper copy can be requested.

All children have a log in to Times Tables Rock Stars and Rollama to practice times tables and grammar for up to 5 minutes, four times a week.

Children on Accelerated Reader should read for a total of 20 minutes a day. Some of this time is in school but often children will need to read for 10 minutes at home too.

Creative homework ideas for each class are sent home for the term as an optional extra for those who enjoy such tasks.



Please remember we are using Class Dojo for most communications now. Teachers check Class Dojo throughout the day but there is no guarantee they will see messages; therefore, please ensure you contact the school office in person or via telephone for time-sensitive issues. All pupil absences must be reported to the school office.

Class Dojo should <u>not</u> be used as a chat function to communicate widely. Please be mindful that every parent and staff member in a chat receives notifications for every message sent. These chats should only be used by the school to communicate with a whole class.

Children should <u>not</u> be sending any messages to staff via Class Dojo or commenting on posts. Please ensure you closely monitor your children's communications online.

We would like share our appreciation for keeping interactions on Class Dojo positive.

Staff have noticed an increasing number of children who are clearly not following the law regarding car seats and seat belts. Children opening windows to wave and not wearing seat belts correctly are causing a serious concern. Whilst we will make plans in school to address these issues with the children in PSHE this term, please ensure you reiterate these lessons to children and reinforce safety rules while driving.
